Bio: Dr. Zhai is an Associate Professor in Atmospheric Physics at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC). He earned his Ph.D. in Physics from Texas A&M University. His research focuses on light scattering by irregular particles, vector radiative transfer in coupled atmosphere-ocean systems, and remote sensing of aerosols and hydrosols. Dr. Zhai specializes in developing advanced remote sensing algorithms for aerosols and ocean color, utilizing satellite and airborne measurements from multi-directional, multi-wavelength, and multi-polarized sensors.

Dr. Zhai became a member of the COAA community in 2024, serving as president-elect, and assumed the role of president in 2025. During his tenure, he is committed to fostering greater awareness and cohesion within the COAA community and building a strong platform to support the career development of young scientists.

After Dr. Zhai assumed the presidency, we conducted a brief interview to provide the community with insight into his leadership philosophy.

>>> Q1: What do you think COAA can/should bring to the members?

Dr. Zhai: COAA has long been an effective connector, bringing members together and fostering a strong sense of community. Through initiatives like community-building events, annual banquets, peer recognition, and the distinguished lecture series, we support both young scientists and seasoned professionals in building networks and advancing their careers. I am committed to building on these strengths and exploring new ways to support and empower our members.

Q2: What are your priorities during the next two-years' service as the president?

Dr. Zhai: As we navigate the uncertainties in atmospheric and oceanic science, my priority is to work closely with our community to overcome these challenges and demonstrate resilience. I will focus on creating support systems for the younger generation of scientists, helping them develop the resources and opportunities they need to thrive.

Q3: What is your vision for the long-term development for COAA?

Dr. Zhai: My long-term vision is to transform COAA into a dynamic hub for scientific exchange, enhancing the visibility of our work and accelerating the career development of our members. The first step will be to encourage more involvement in public service roles within COAA so that everyone benefits from the collective contributions of the community.






